INSTEAD of the standard "Public footpath" sign of green and white enamelled metal West Suffolk highways committee favour an oak sign with the words burnt into it. This was shown to a meeting of the committee recently by the county surveyor, Mr. E. L. Williams, who said it was the type in use in West Sussex. It cost £1 10s. for the post and sign, compared with £6 for the standard sign and, he thought, was more in keeping with the countryside.

For an expenditure of £100 the committee could put a post at each end of about 30 footpaths.

It was agreed to consult the countryside sub-committee and to ask the rural district councils to submit short lists of the most important footpaths in their districts.
